J. Scott Ferguson is Professor of Music and Director of Choral Activities at Illinois Wesleyan University, where he conducts the Collegiate Choir and University Choir and teaches studio voice, choral conducting, and choral literature. Dr. Ferguson received his undergraduate training at Oberlin Conservatory in organ performance, studying with Haskell Thomson. He completed graduate studies in choral conducting at the University of California, Irvine, earning the Master of Fine Arts, and the University of Wisconsin, Madison, where he earned the Doctor of Musical Arts. He has studied choral conducting with Robert Fountain, Joseph Huszti, Daniel Moe, and Howard Swan, orchestral conducting with David Becker and James Smith, and voice

with Robert Fountain, Joseph Huszti, and Beverly Rinaldi. Prior to his appointment at Illinois Wesleyan University in 1996, he served on the faculty at the State Conservatory of Music in Bratislava, Slovak Republic, Hope College, Plymouth State University, The College of Wooster, and the University of California, Irvine. His choirs have appeared on tour throughout the United States and Europe and have performed at state and regional ACDA and NAfME conferences. Dr. Ferguson is in demand as a choral clinician, festival conductor, and adjudicator, and has presented choral workshops and lectures in the U. S., Europe, and South America. Dr. Ferguson directs the Chapel Choir at Second Presbyterian Church in Bloomington and is organist and cantor at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Chenoa, IL.

Prof. Chia-fen Weng /Taiwan/



Dr. Chia-Fen Weng is one of the most active and outstanding choral conductors in Taiwan. She employs profound interpretation on an extensive choral repertoire and premiers many new Taiwanese commission works. She delicates herself to choral educations and development of her country and has been invited to be the jury or lecturer at international choral festivals and competitions. Born in Taipei, after graduating from National Taiwan Normal University, Chia-Fen Weng went to University of Texas at Austin in USA to study with Dr. M. Beachy and received her D. M. A. degree in Choral Conducting in 1995. In the following year, Dr. Weng returned to Taiwan to teach at National Sun Yat-sen University in Taiwan. In

2000, she also becomes a part-time conducting faculty at National Taiwan Normal University. She is a passionate and committed teacher of conducting and strongly believes in a creative approach to learning and teaching. In 2002, Weng, with several music colleagues, founded Kaohsiung Chamber Choir and has worked with the choir since then. Under her enthusiastic professional directions, KCC becomes one of the best choruses in Taiwan. She contributes to the musical life of southern Taiwan by organizing choral activities and concerts. Dr. Weng is currently the president of Taiwan Choral Association, member of IFCM and life member of ACDA.

## INTERNATIONAL JURY

#### doc. Elena Šarayová-Kováčová /Slovakia/

Elena Šarayová-Kováčová studied piano, composition and conducting at Bratislava Music Conservatory. Later she continued her conducting studies at the University of Performing Arts (VŠMU) in Bratislava to become the first female professional conductor in Slovakia. In addition to Female Chamber Orchestra, she has been also leading Bratislava Children's Choir (since 1967), and between 1971 and 1986 she was the conductor and the art director of the Slovak Teacher Female Choir OZVENA. With these music ensembles she has performed at many stages in almost all European countries as well as in Japan, Canada, USA, and in Africa. Her concert activities



frequently alternate with methodical work as a jury member at various competitions, teacher work at manifold choir workshops and conductors training. She teaches at the composition and conducting at the Department of the Dance and Music Faculty at the University of Performing Arts in Bratislava.

## MgA. Marek Klimeš /Czech Republic/

He is currently graduate of Orchestra conducting at the Janáček Academy of Music and Performing Arts (JAMU) in Brno in class of professor Rostislav Hališka. He is also a graduate of Choir conducting at Palacký University in Olomouc. His conducting career started with choir Campanella Olomouc with which he's been through tens of concerts in the Czech Republic and abroad (Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Spain, Slovenia, France, Russia, Argentina, Thailand and more). He also collaborated with chamber choir Bel Canto. As a conductor he is laureate of following awards: Neerpelt (Belgium) 2007 gold medal, first award, Grand Prix St. Petersburg 2008 silver medal,



Musica Religiosa Olomouc 2009 gold medal. He used to be acting conductor of university choir Coro Grande at the Department of Music Education of Palacký University. During his studies at JAMU in Brno, he's had many experiences of orchestra conducting. He performed with many orchestral projects, he collaborated with The Moravian Philharmonic Orchestra, The Orchestra of Bohuslav Martinů Zín, Pilsen Philharmonics, Janáček's Academic Orchestra etc. For two years he's been art director and conductor of Chordata – a chamber orchestra of JAMU students. During his studies he's attended numerous conducting classes (G. Richter, Z. Nagy, T. Netopil etc.) Since 2014 he's become the director of Festa Musicale and of other cultural projects, previously led by his father, Jiří Klimeš.

## **M**EDZINÁRODNÁ POROTA



#### Prof. David Slater / Australia/

David Slater is an experienced conductor, having worked under the former Chief Conductor of the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. He has conducted student, amateur and professional orchestras and choirs throughout the world, and many seasons of musical theatre. Mr Slater has founded and directed a number of awardwinning music organisations which include contemporary music ensembles, orchestras, choirs, youth orchestras and musical

theatre companies. He is a regular quest conductor of orchestras and choirs, workshop conductor for schools, music camps and festivals, and conducts masterclasses in many parts of the world, most recently in Austria, Latvia and Russia. He has worked with choirs and orchestras from the USA, Spain, France, Hungary, China, Singapore, Taiwan, Japan, UK, Ireland, Hong Kong and in Australia. Mr Slater is an Australian composer and a Represented Artist with the Australian Music Centre. He studied at the University of Sydney followed by post-graduate studies on scholarship in Germany. His work, twice short-listed for Australia's richest composition award, includes genres from the concert hall to TV, film and advertising. It encompasses solo, chamber, choral and orchestral music from professional to student levels. He receives regular commissions and his work is performed throughout Australia and the world. He has over 35 years' experience as a music educator at tertiary and secondary level, with 25 years as Director of Music. He has taught and lectured in 3 Australian states, at the School of Music at the Australian National University, on the sessional staff of the Oueensland Conservatorium of music and in elite schools. He has been a consultant on music curriculum and given seminars in several countries. He is passionate about the place of music in society and in education, and has promoted the creation, study and performance of great music throughout his career. Mr Slater is sought after as a performance adjudicator, having worked with many organisations, festivals and eisteddfods. Positions have included final year examiner in three Australian states and jury member for festivals around the world. These include the World Choir Games in Sochi (Russia), the Summa Cum Laude International Youth Music Festival in Vienna (Austria) the Leonardo da Vinci and Lorenzo de'Medici International Choral Festivals in Florence (Italy), the European Choir Games and Choral Grand Prix of Nations in Riga (Latvia), the Queen of the Adriatic Sea International Choral Competition in Cattolica (Italy), the Rimini International Choral Festival (Italy) and the Bratislava International Youth Music Festivals (Slovakia). He has won many major awards for composition, conducting and services to music in the community, including the Symphony Australia Prize, the National Award of the Orchestras of Australia Network and Australia Day awards for services to music in the community. He has published articles on music and music education and is Australia's representative to the World Choir Council.

## **ART DIRECTOR OF THE FESTIVAL**





Milan Kolena is a conductor, artistic director of Bratislava Music Festivals, Associate Professor of choral conducting and Gregorian Chant at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava and the president of the Slovak Choral Association. With his choir Apollo and Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis Milan Kolena visited many prestigious choral competitions. In 2014 he gave lectures at three American universities: Illinois Wesleyan University School, University of Missouri School of Music, Colorado State

University. He frequently works as a member of the jury at various international choral and orchestral competitions in Slovakia, Europe and Asia. He was awarded the best conductor special prize of the "Singing World" choral competition in St. Petersburg, Russia in 2015. In the same year he held choral workshops in China and Hong Kong. He is a member of the International Council of the World Choir Games and Vice President World Youth and Children Choral Artists' Association. In 2018 he received the first place with his Apollo choir at "Moscow Sounds" Festival in Folk Music category and a Grand Prix for Sacred Music category.

## PRAVIDLÁ SÚŤAŽE / COMPETITION RULES

#### Súťažný repertoár

Časový limit jednotlivých súťažných vystúpení pre spevácke zbory je 15 minút (klavír bude k dispozícii). Časový limit pre inštrumentálne telesá je 20 minút.

Program môže pozostávať z voľného výberu skladieb.

#### Diplomy

Podľa počtu získaných bodov medzinárodná porota udeľuje:

Diplom za účasť do 59,99 bodov

Bronzové pásmo 60 - 74,9 bodov

Strieborné pásmo 75 - 89,9 bodov

Zlaté pásmo 90 - 100 bodov

Grand Prix - podľa rozhodnutia poroty, s minimálnym počtom 97 bodov.

#### Ceny

Každé teleso dostane diplom s označením pásma, v ktorom sa umiestnilo. Porota može udeliť aj mimoriadne ceny napr. za dramaturgiu programu, hlasovú kultúru, štýlovú intepretácii, dirigentský výkon a pod. Výsledky poroty sú konečné a nedá sa proti nim odvolať.

#### **Competition repertoire**

The time limit of each performance for choirs is 15 minutes (a piano will be available). The time limit for instrumental groups is 20 minutes.

The choice of competition repertoire is free.

#### **Diplomas**

According to the number of acquired points, the international jury will award:

Participation diploma up to 59.99 p.

Bronze Band 60 - 74.9 points

Silver Band 75 - 89.9 points

Golden Band 90 - 100 points

Grand Prix - according to the jury decision, with the minimum of 97 points.

#### **Prizes**

Each participating ensemble will be awarded a diploma with the certification of the band awarded by the jury. The jury may award special prizes e.g. for program dramaturgy, voice culture, performance style, conducting performance, etc.

The jury's decisions are final, there are no appeals.

## ŽUPANIJSKI TAMBURAŠKI ORKESTAR "STJEPAN BUJAN STIPIĆ" ČAKOVEC /CROATIA/



#### Conductor: Mr Tomislav Cvrtila

"Sjepan Bujan – Stipić" County Tamburica Orchestra Biography "Stjepan Bujan – Stipić" County Tamburica Orchestra was founded in Čakovec in October 1997. The orchestra has carried the name of its longtime conductor, Stjepan Bujan – Stipić, since his



early demise in 2005, as a way of honouring and acknowledging his work. Since its first public performance in 1998, the orchestra has performed all across Croatia and its neighbouring countries, winning many awards in state competitions. So far, the orchestra has won more than dozen "Pajo Kolarić Tambura" plaques (ten golden, one silver and two bronze) at the International festival of Croatian tambura music in Osijek. It is regularly ranked in top three at the

"Tamburica Orchestra and Ensemble Gathering" organised by the Croatian Cultural Association, and in 2018 it won the first prize for the best performance of a domestic author and the third prize for the overall performance. The orchestra's current conductor is Tomislav Cvrtila.

Tomislav Cvrtila (Koprivnica, 1986) graduated from Music Pedagogy at the Music Academy in Zagreb. At the end of his study, he started working at the Music School Fortunat Pintarić in Koprivnica as a professor of music theory and the head of the children's choir. His choir has achieved a remarkable result at the "Music Festival of the Croatian Music Youth" in Varaždin. The most significant international awards he won were "The International Youth Choir Festival, Celje, Slovenia", "The 4th Music Competition of Town Palmanova" and "The 14th Croatian Singing Choir Competition - Zagreb 2018". Since 2015 he has been the head of the mixed choir "Dr Vinko Žganec" in Vratišinec. In 2017 he takes over the managing of County Tamburitza Orchestra 'Stjepan Bujan Stipić" from Čakovec and achieves outstanding results on national shows and international competitions.



Since its foundation in 1881, Caulfield Grammar School has grown to become one of Australia's most renowned and influential coeducational day and boarding schools Supported by over sixty specialist teachers, the Music curriculum comprises of classroom music lessons from Pre-Prep to Year 8. The classroom program is based on the philosophical principles of Kodaly – whereby

all students have an instrument. their voice! The co-curricular program is comprised of fifty ensembles, ranging from orchestras, bands and small ensembles - to auditioned chamber orchestras, stage bands and choirs. The School has two high level, auditioned Wind Ensembles that rehearse separately at our two senior campuses. Our touring Wind Ensemble is comprised of students from both Wind Ensembles and provides our students with another experience that fosters friendships and the sharing of music across our whole school and into the global community. The touring ensemble is directed by Mr. Simon Brown (Head of Brass) and Mrs. Karen Bouyer (Head of Woodwind), having a combined 60 years of conducting and teaching experience.



Simon holds degrees from the University of Melbourne and the University of Tasmania and has primarily studied conducting with Rob McWilliams, Monte Mumford, also briefly with Richard Gill OA, Graham Abbott and Craig Kirchhoff. He has directed various Wind Ensembles, which have toured nationally and internationally through New Zealand, Europe and the USA.

Karen Bouyer is an experienced music educator based in Melbourne, Australia. She began her teaching career in 1987 teaching clarinet, saxophone and flute at Killester College. Karen is currently the Head of Woodwind at Caulfield Grammar School working with a team of nine other woodwind specialists.

Stringendo String Orchestra is a collaboration between Bloemhof Girl's High and Paul Roos Gymnasium, neighbouring high schools in Stellenbosch, South Africa. The orchestra originally consisted of only a handful of players, but currently boasts 25 members. In the orchestra we aim to provide an opportunity for string players from these two schools to hone their skills, regardless of their proficiency. Any string



player may join, as long as they are enthusiastic and willing to work hard. Stringendo has performed with various South African artists during local music festivals. They also regularly participate in eisteddfods. In 2018 they won the category for best senior string orchestra at the Stellenbosch Eisteddfod. They play a wide variety of music: from standard classics to film and popular music, as well as some traditional South African compositions. Stringendo participated in the 2011 Bratislava music festival, but for the current members of the orchestra this is their first international venture.

Amoré Steyn graduated from the University of Pretoria with a Bachelor's Degree in Performance (piano) and a Master's Degree in Musicology. She also holds a Teacher's Licenciate from the University of South Africa (UNISA). She has performed as soloist (piano) with different orchestras, and as violist she has also played in different local orchestras and ensembles. She has fifteen years' experience as music teacher, in various schools in Gauteng and the Western Cape, South Africa. She is currently employed by Bloemhof Girls' High School, where she teaches Piano, Theory, Music History and Creative Arts.

In 2016 Amoré became the conductor Stringendo Orchestra. Under her tutelage Stringendo has increased size and named best high school string orchestra at the 2018 Stellenbosch Eisteddfod.

Each member of this ensemble are involved in the Stage Band program at St Peter's College and attend two Big band rehearsals, sectionals and 1 improvisation class

with their improvisation tutor Mr Derek Pascoe weekly. These five boys participate in the most senior of our four big bands at St Peter's College. Boys audition yearly to join this Jazz program which is graded and led by the St Peter's College Director of Music Mr Philip Walsh. The St Peter's College Jazz Ensemble are tutored by Mr Derek Pascoe who wish the boys well in their performance today as he will not be in attendance at the festival. These young men perform in many school concerts and functions and In 2018 they attended Australia's most prestigious national jazz competition 'Generations in Jazz', and they were successful in winning division two , which means in 2019 they will be one of 10 big bands entering division one.



Mr Philip Walsh is currently the Director of music at St Peter's College in Adelaide, South Australia who has over 20 years of extensive domestic and international experience running Music and Performing arts programs within schools while simultaneously pursuing his own professional music and performing career. In 2018 he was awarded the highly acclaimed James Morrison Band Directors award in recognition for outstanding leadership and inspiration the field of jazz. Philip also worked in musical theatre as the Musical Director, repetiteur and pianist and toured professionally throughout Australia, London and Europe performing in several Australian musical theatre productions, and London's West End shows.

Choir Apollo was established in 1995 and in a short time the choir made considerable strides, achieving notoriety in Slovakia and receiving many awards at festivals and international competitions e.g. in Prague (1998), Český Krumlov (2002), Olomouc (2005).The choir often gives performances


at prestigious local and international events.




Apollo has toured Italy and other countries performing concerts at festivals in Citta´ di Nuoro, Rome, Fano, Loreto, Olbia; Poznan, Poland; Banja Luka, Bosna Hercegovina; Szeged, Miskolc, Hungary; Munich, Germany; Prague, Olomouc, Brno and Pardubice, Czech Republic; Vienna, Austria as well as in many Slovak towns. The choir´s repertoire focuses on current sacred Slovak works; the choir interprets extensive pieces by outstanding Slovak composer Pavol Krška, including Stabat Mater; Rekviem; Te Deum for solo, choir and organ; Missa Solemnis for organ, sola and mixed choir. The Apollo repertoire also includes sacred choruses from the Gregorian Chant

period, as well as Renaissance and Romantic period selections; spirituals, folksongs and carols in choir arrangements. Choir Apollo has recorded a CD of Anton Bruckner works – Moteta in 2003 and made a recording of Pavol Krška's Rekviem for two choirs, sola and organ in 2012. The choir regularly sings at Holy Masses in Jesuit and other churches in Bratislava and gives charity concerts for children oncology hospital in Bratislava. It performs concerts also with University of Performing Arts soloists or in cooperation with other Slovak or foreign choirs.

Milan Kolenais conductor, artistic director of Bratislava Music Festivals, teacher of choral conducting and Gregorian Chant at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava and the president of Slovak Choral Association. With his choir Apollo and Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis Milan Kolena visited many prestigious choral competitions all over the Europe. During 2004-2006 together with Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis recorded 3 CDs of Bratislava antiphons for Slovak National Library. In 2014 he gave lectures at three American universities: Illinois Wesleyan University School, University of Missouri School of Music, Colorado State University, topic: The Question of the Interpretation of Latin texts in Sacred Choral Music. He frequently works as a member of the jury at many international choral and orchestral competitions in Slovakia, Europe and Asia.

Bratislava is a beautiful city full of culture that is gradually being discovered by visitors from all over the world. It also has the reputation of the city of music, offering its visitors and citizens rich and coulourful music events throughout the year. #### St. Martin's Cathedral

This Gothic cathedral constructed in the 14th century served as coronation place of Hungarian kings from 1563 to 1830 . The cathedral's important

#### **Primate's Palace**

The monumental Renaissance palace rebuilt in Classicist style used to be the seat of Cardinal Jozef Batthyányi. The palace's function is symbolized by a black cardinal's hat that can be seen on the top of the roof. In the past, the palace witnessed many crucial moments in the country's history, e.g. signing of the "Peace of Bratislava" after Napoleon's victory at the Battle of Austerlitz. Today it houses a precious collection of paintings and tapestries with ancient Greek motives that were discovered by chance during the palace's reconstruction.



#### Jesuit church

The church was built in 1638 in neo-renaissance style and is one of the biggest Bratislava churches. Its simple exterior decoration contrasts to the beautifully ornated interior. The two side naves are adorned with beutiful baroque altars from the 18th century. The main altar with monumental pillars comes from the 19th century. One of the church's highlights is a unique rococo pulpit from 1753 made of unusual combination of wood, lead and gold. The church has a very good accoustics and is often a venue of classic and sacred music concerts.



#### Main square

The history of the square dates back to the early Medieval period when there used to be a market and the place of citizens' meetings and trials. The Old Town Hall with Gothic interiors and baroque steeple today houses the city museum and often hosts concerts of classic, jazz of folk music in the courtyard. The square's main highlight is the fountain with the statue of the famous knight Roland who, as the legends say, used to dwell in Bratislava for a long time.
