



MEDZINÁRODNÁ POROTA / INTERNATIONAL JURY

Prof. Monika Mielko-Remiszewska /Poland/ chairwoman of the jury

Prof. Monika Mielko-Remiszewska is a graduate of Maria Curie-Skłodowska University, majoring in Music Education (1988), as well as Postgraduate Choirmaster Studies (2000) and Postgraduate Voice Emission Studies (2002) at the F. Nowowiejski Academy of Music in Bydgoszcz. She began working at the Institute of Artistic Education at UMCS in Lublin in 1987 as a trainee assistant. She is currently a professor of musical arts, lecturing on subjects such as conducting, score reading, vocal ensembles, and vocal technique. Since 1993, she has been the conductor of the Academic Choir of the Medical University of Lublin. She has prepared and conducted over 700 concerts, including 18 oratorio vocal-instrumental works (e.g., Messiah



by G.F. Handel and St. John Passion by J.S. Bach). Under her direction, the choir has won over 40 awards and distinctions at national and international choral festivals and competitions. Prof. Mielko-Remiszewska is also an active promoter of musical life. Since 2014, she has served as the president of the Lublin Branch of the Polish Association of Choirs and Orchestras (PZChiO), and since 2022, as the vice-president of the PZChiO's Management in Warsaw. Since 2015, she has also been the president of the Dr. M. Hajnos Academic Cultural Association, which supports the Academic Choir of the Medical University and the Academic Children's Choir "Pueri Nostri", of which she is the founder and artistic director. In 2016, she became the director of the International Festival of Choral Music CANTANTES LUBLINENSIS in Lublin. She also serves on the jury of national and international competitions, including the Prof. Jan Szyrocki International Festival of Choral Song in Międzyzdroje and the Prof. Józef Świder International Festival of Music in Cieszyn. Her achievements have been recognized with numerous honors, including the Bronze and Silver Cross of Merit, the Medal of the Commission of National Education (KEN), the 700th Anniversary Medal of the City of Lublin, the 450th Anniversary Medal of the Union of Lublin, and the Medal of Merit for the Medical University of Lublin.

MEDZINÁRODNÁ POROTA / INTERNATIONAL JURY

Assoc. Prof. Milan Kolena, ArtD. /Slovakia/

Milan Kolena is one of Europe's most dynamic choral conductors and educators. As artistic director of major international festivals in Bratislava, he brings together over 1,500 performers annually through seven festivals that unite musicians from around the world in powerful harmony. At the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava, he mentors future conductors with passion for choral conducting and Gregorian chant. With his ensembles — the Apollo Choir and Schola Gregoriana Bratislavensis — he's won top prizes and wowed audiences across Europe, Russia, South Africa, and Asia. His workshops and masterclasses, from the U.S. to China, are known for their energy, depth, and inspiration. In 2015, he was named Best Conductor at the Singing World Festival in St.



Petersburg. As a jury member at the World Choir Games and competitions worldwide, he champions artistic excellence and youth talent. His Apollo Choir has captured Grand Prix titles in Moscow (2018), Barcelona (2023), and Greece (2024). He also serves as Vice President of the World Youth and Children Choral Artists' Association and Member of the INTERKULTUR World Choir Council. Dr. Kolena believes in the power of music to connect hearts, cross borders, and change the world — one voice at a time.

Assoc. Prof. Ondrej Šaray, ArtD. /Slovakia/



Ondrej Šaray studied orchestral conducting with Zdeněk Bílek at the Conservatory in Bratislava. He also studied with Ladislav Slovák at the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts in Bratislava. Since 1983 he has worked as the conductor of the Bratislava Children's Choir. In 1987 he estabilished the Youth Choir Echo and in 1992 the Amadeus Choir Bratislava. Ondrej Šaray has won many significant domestic and international awards with these choirs. As a conductor, he has performed throughout Europe, Canada, Africa, the USA and he also cooperated with the noted orchestras of Slovakia (Philharmonic Orchestra, State Philharmonic Orchestra Košice, State Chamber Orchestra Žilina). He and his choirs appear regularly in vocalinstrumental compositions with the Slovak Philharmonic

Orchestra, Slovak Chamber Orchestra of Bohdan Warchal, Capella Istropolitana and Musica Aeterna. Ondrej Šaray has also made recordings for Slovak Radio, Slovak Television and BBC London. Besides conducting, he teaches at the Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts in Bratislava.

Academic Choir of the Veterinary Faculty Phrenicus /SL/

Conductor: Mrs. Katja Bogovič

Academic Choir of the Veterinary Faculty Phrenicus has been active since 2014. The choir offers not only exploring and interpreting a diverse repertoire of choral literature, but also great company and opportunities to build new connections and friendships. The choir performs at various faculty events and conferences within the field of veterinary science. Each May, it concludes its season with an annual concert. Last academic year, the choir took to competitive stages for the first time. It returned from the regional competition with a gold award of distinction and a special prize for the best performance of a Slovenian folk song. At the national competition Naša pesem. Slovenia's most renowned choirs, it was awarded a high silver plague. Since 2018, the choir has been led by Katja Bogovič.



Katja Bogovič graduated with honours in musicology at the Faculty of Arts, University of Liubliana. During her studies. she upgraded her knowledge of solo singing with prof. Mihaela Komočar Gorše and prof. Barbara Nagode and has been member of a mixed choir (conductor Sebastjan Vrhovnik) and a chamber choir (conductor Marko Vatovec) of the Academy of Music in Liubliana. She is currently conducting Men's choir Kapele and the Academic Choir of the Veterinary Faculty in Ljubljana while also being an artistic leader and mezzosoprano in Vocal group Aria. She is a recipient of awards at regional and international competitions for performing competition programs and individual compositions.

At the Slovenian national choir competition in 2024 she was recognized as a young promising conductor. Being a enthusiast cultural also transfers her profession as she works in the programme office of one of the most



important festivals in Slovenia and Europe, Festival Ljubljana.

Conductor: Mr. Jan Chumchal



The girls' choir Ars Voce has been active at the Pedagogical High School in Krnov since 2002. when it was founded by teacher and choir conductor Kamil Trávníček. The conductor principal and artistic director teacher Jan Chumchal, Ars Voce regularly performs concerts and

participates in important national and international festivals. The choir is mainly composed of students studying to become preschool teachers. Its repertoire includes compositions from various musical genres and stylistic periods.

PhDr. Jan Chumchal, Ph.D., graduated in Music Education and Civic Education at the Faculty of Education of the University of Ostrava, where he completed his postgraduate studies in Music Theory and Pedagogy in 2021. His research focuses on the didactics of music education and the

musical culture of the Wallachia region. He has been working with the girls' choir Ars Voce since 2016. He currently teaches at the Pedagogical High School in Krnov and the Department of Music Education at the University of Ostrava.

Bratislavský detský zbor/SK/

Conductor: Mr. Robert Tišťan

Bratislava children choir was founded in 1962 at the Municipal Cultural Centre in Bratislava. Since 1967, the choir performed on stages in fifteen European countries, Japan, Canada, Africa and the USA, and has performed with the Slovak Philharmonic Orchestra, Róbert Tišťan became the conductor of the choir in 2007 and the choir has managed to expand its membership and gradually regain its longstanding successful tradition since then. Every year BADZ presents itself not only to the domestic audience, but also at festivals abroad. In 2017 the choir recorded a CD and toured Slovak cities. In 2018 the choir won the International Competition Canco Mediterrania in Lloret de Mar and Barcelona. 1st place in the folk music category and 2nd place in the sacred music category.

Robert Tišt'an studied church music and conducting at the Conservatory in Žilina, followed by studies at the Academy of Performing Arts and the Faculty of Education at Comenius University in Bratislava. After completing his education, he began teaching at the Church Conservatory and the Miloš Ruppeldt Elementary Arts School (ZUŠ) in Bratislava, where he continues to work as a lecturer of specialized subjects and, most notably, as a conductor. He leads the CKBA Choir, the Bratislava Children's Choir (BADZ), and the Miloš Ruppeldt Elementary Arts School String

Orchestra. From 2013 to 2021, he served as the conductor of the Donaustimmen mixed choir in Wolfsthal, Austria. With these ensembles, he regularly performs on concert

stages both in Slovakia and abroad. In addition to these roles, he is the artistic director of the vocal section of the group Big Names, with whom he has performed in Dubai, Turkey, England, and other European countries.

Choirchestra /CZ/

Conductor: Mr. Eduard Kostelník

The Choirchestra Mixed Choir was founded in 2010 by a group of friends with previous choral experience and their own vision. Choirchestra does not have a genre-specific repertoire: the ensemble performs art choral compositions by Czech and foreign composers from the Renaissance to the 21st century, as well as arrangements of folk songs and spirituals, and often also compositions belonging to popular music. Concerts are dramaturgically conceived with regard to the chosen topic. The choir also performs contemporary music (in 2021 the premiere of D. Šimek's Lux aeterna, in 2024 the Czech premiere of L. Bernáth's Brevi oratione pro defunctis). In 2024. Choirchestra won the golden award at the Festival of Songs in Olomouc in the Mixed Choirs category and made it to the competition for the absolute winner. Since 2022 the choir has been led by Eduard Kostelník.

Eduard Kostelník comes from the historical town of Levoča. After graduating from organ and conducting at the Košice Conservatory, he went on to the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in choral conducting. In 2021 he started his studies in orchestra conducting at the Janáček Academy of Performing Arts in Brno. As part of his studies, he is actively involved in the

Chamber Opera the JAMU. where collaborated he as an accompanist on the staging of the operas Dialogues of Carmelites the bν F. Poulanc, The Two Widows by B. Smetana and Calvary by Markéta Brothánková. He also served as assistant



conductor of the contemporary opera J.A.K from Labyrinth by Noema Savková, which premiered at the Janáček Brno Festival. At the beginning of 2023 he was assistant conductor at the National Theratre Brno for the opera Falstaff by G. Verdi and also collaborated with the Moravian Philharmonic Orchestra Olomouc (2023, 2024) and PKF - Prague Phillharmonia (2023). Within the JAMU Chamber Opera he has staged the operas The Coronation of Poppea by Claudio Monteverdi and the one-act opera In the Well by Vilém Blodek.

Conductor: Mrs. Diana Mrugała-Gromek

Con Fuoco is a mixed academic choir founded at AGH University of Science and Technology in Kraków. Known for its vibrant energy and diverse repertoire, the choir performs classical, sacred, and contemporary choral music, often



combining traditional Polish works with international pieces. Con Fuoco actively participates in national and international competitions, achieving numerous awards and distinctions. The ensemble has proudly represented AGH University abroad, performing in countries such as Germany, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Macedonia, Ukraine, France, Lithuania, and Slovenia. The choir also plays an integral role in the university's cultural life, engaging in academic ceremonies, concerts, and artistic projects.

The choir is led by Diana Mrugała-Gromek, a distinguished choral conductor and musician with extensive experience in working with vocal ensembles. In 2007, she graduated with honors from the Academy of Music in Kraków, specializing in the Faculty of Composition, Interpretation, and Music Education. She also completed Postgraduate Studies in Cultural

Management at Jagiellonian University in Kraków. She specializes in choral conducting and vocal training. Under her leadership, Con Fuoco has achieved a high artistic standard, earning recognition for its musical precision, expressiveness, and dynamic interpretations. Diana Mrugała-Gromek passionately nurtures young talents, shaping their skills and inspiring a love for choral music. Kassiopea is a women's choir established in 2006 in Olomouc under the direction of Mgr. Hana Vyroubalová. The choir regularly performs at spring and Christmas concerts, as well as at many other cultural events in the Olomouc region. Over the years, Kassiopea has participated in national and international choral festivals, such as the 2013 festival in Ternopil, Ukraine, where it won 3rd place, and the Jihlava Choral Art Festival in 2014, where it received a silver award. In 2017, 2019, and 2023, the choir earned a gold award at the Festival of Songs Olomouc. In 2017, Kassiopea performed with the swing orchestra New Street Band in the musical Kéž by tisíc klarinetů, which won the Olomouc Region Culture Award for 2016.

Choirmaster Mgr. Hana Vyroubalová graduated from the Faculty of Education at Palacký University in Olomouc, majoring in primary teacher training and music education. She has been involved in music since the age of five when she began singing in the Olomouc choir Campanella under the direction of choirmaster Jiří Klimeš.

During her studies at university. she decided to found her own choir, and in 1993, she began working with the organization BoDo centrum z.s.. under whose hanner she established the choir Music BoDo Olomouc. Today, the organization consists of six choirs,



catering to children from the age of three up to an adult female choir. In addition to her work with choirs, she enjoys singing with a band in her free time and performs in various musical groups.

With over 35 years of tradition and numerous awards, the Orfej Chamber Choir from Liutomer is recognized as one of Slovenia's most prominent vocal ensembles. Founded in 1989, the choir initially thrived under the leadership of Romana Rek, later collaborating with acclaimed conductor Janez Bole and performing as Slovenski madrigalisti. Since 2010, the choir has occasionally worked with Andraž Hauptman, who became artistic director in 2017. succeeded by Vito Žerdin in 2023. Orfei has demonstrated excellence on competitive stages, winning three gold plaques at the Slovenian national competition since 2010 and receiving international acclaim. Recent achievements include 4th place and a



conductor's prize at the 2023 Fleischmann International Trophy in Ireland, a gold plaque and audience award at the 2022 Ave Verum competition in Austria and multiple honors at national events.

Vito Žerdin pursued his music education at the Academy of Music, University of Ljubljana, graduating in 2014 under Professor Marko Vatovec, focusing on music education and conducting. During his studies, he actively assisted the artistic directors of the Orfej Chamber Choir, gaining valuable experience in choral leadership.



He further refined his expertise through workshops with renowned conductors such as Sebastjan Vrhovnik, Petra Grassi, Gary Graden, and Stojan Kuret. In 2023, after years as an assistant conductor, he became the artistic director of the Orfej Chamber Choir. Beyond Orfej, Vito Žerdin teaches music at Ljutomer Primary School and also conducts and collaborates with various other vocal ensembles.

Mješoviti pjevački zbor Nadbiskupske klasične gimnazije s pravom javnosti /HR/

Conductor: Mrs. Ankica Juričić

Mixed Choir of Nadbiskupska Klasična Gimnazija was founded in the autumn of 1999, inspired by a decadeslong tradition of boys singing in the lower seminary. Initially established as the NKG vocal ensemble, the choir gradually grew and became a boys' choir. In 2003, when the school began enrolling girls, the choir transformed into a mixed choir. Young choristers sing at liturgical services and actively participate in school projects, with the school's traditional Advent concert, "Advent na Šalati," being a standout event. The choir has performed across Croatia and participated in music festivals for students of Catholic grammar schools. as well as music creativity festivals for primary and secondary school students in



Zagreb. Notable collaborations include performances with the Orchestra of the Croatian Armed Forces. The boys' choir has won awards four times at the Croatian Youth Music Festivities in Varaždin, while the mixed choir has received several awards, including four silver plaques and one gold plaque. This school year, the choir celebrates its 25th anniversary under the direction of Ankica Juričić, who has led it since its beginning.

Ankica Juričić (born 1965 in Slavonski Brod, Croatia) graduated from the Academy of Music, University of Sarajevo, with a degree in music theory and pedagogy. She then continued her studies for two years at the Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory,

majoring in choral conducting. Stuttgart, she took a choral conducting master course Helmut under Rilling. From 1991 to 1996, she was the choral conductor of the university choir "Palma," with whom she recorded a CD titled Hrvatska



liturgijska glazba 20. st (Croatian Liturgical Music of the 20th Century). This CD was nominated for the Croatian music award Porin in 1996. During this time, she closely collaborated with the Croatian Chamber Orchestra and conducted Missa solemnis in Es Major by Ivan pl. Zajc. Since 1998, she has been working at Nadbiskupska Klasična Gimnazija s pravom javnosti in Zagreb as a music teacher and school choir conductor. While conducting the school's boys' choir and mixed choir, she has won five silver plaques and one gold plaque at state choir competitions, including the Croatian Youth Music Festivities, held annually in Varaždin.

Mladinski pevski zbor Mavrica /SL/

Conductor: Mrs. Alenka Brulc-Šiplič

Mladinski pevski zbor Mavrica comes from the land of storks, cymbals, and good people. The people of Prekmurje are cheerful, and song is a faithful companion on many occasions. Singing at the school has a long and rich tradition, with the choir participating in every school event and various community events. It also takes part in regional choir meetings,



consistently receiving high marks. Each year, the choir is selected to participate in regional competitions, earning three silver and three gold awards. In 2011, the choir was chosen as one of the 13 most talented junior choirs in Slovenia and performed at the major event Travelling Music in Ljubljana. Over the years, the choir has competed in several international competitions, including Svatky pisni (Olomouc), Vallis Aurea Cantat (Požega, Croatia), Slovakia Cantat (Bratislava), and Lege Artis (Tuzla, Bosnia), winning multiple silver and gold prizes.

Alenka Brulc-Šiplič completed her studies in music pedagogy at the Faculty of Education in Maribor in 1985. She worked for six years at Primary School Gornji Petrovci and, since 1991, has taught music and conducted the children's and junior choirs at Primary

School Tišina. Both choirs have been highly successful, consistently receiving excellent grades at the regional level and earning several silver and gold prizes in regional competitions. They have also participated in national competitions, where they earned two bronze and several silver prizes. From 1992 to 2012, she conducted the Mixed Choir Štefan Kovač from Murska Sobota, which competed in international competitions in countries such as Finland (Tampere), Greece (Rhodes), Czech Republic (Chlumec, Olomouc), Slovakia (Bratislava), Hungary (Budapest), Italy (Rome, Riva del Garda, Verona), and Austria (Graz, Linz), winning several silver and gold prizes. The choir also performed in Switzerland and the USA. Throughout these years, she has

continually furthered her education attending national and international choir including seminars. the European Choir Symposium for Choral Music in Liubliana in 1995 and the World Choral Symposium in Rotterdam in 1999. She also participated in two World Choir Olympics, held in Linz and Graz.

The Chamber Choir is an international vocal ensemble with a decade-long tradition. It was founded in 2015 by conductor Monika Pőcze during her studies at the Academy of Performing Arts. Since then, it has evolved into a unique group that brings together voices from Slovakia, Ukraine, Italy, Spain, Czechia, Romania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Philippines, and Korea. The choir boasts



a diverse repertoire that includes popular, spiritual, sacral, classical, and folk music, regularly showcased at concerts throughout Slovakia and abroad. Past performances include the Alexander Duchnovič Theatre in Prešov, the FÚGA Cultural Centre in Košice, Dobrý trh in Bratislava, the City of Bratislava's Christmas programme, and an International Music Festival in Portugal. The choir currently consists of 17 women from various professional fields, ranging from teaching to molecular biology, supported on the piano by an experienced accompanist, Dariia Kashperko (SK/UA).

Monika Pócze graduated with a bachelor's degree in Choral Conducting from the Faculty of Music and Dance at the Academy of Performing Arts in Bratislava, as well as a bachelor's degree in Teacher Education for Pedagogy and Musical Arts - Singing, from the Faculty of Education at Comenius

University in Bratislava. She has participated in courses on choral conducting and vocal training in choirs in Prague (Czech Republic) and Havlíčkova Borová (Czech Republic), and in Master classes in orchestral conducting in Rome (Italy). She is also a former member of the Choir of the Lúčnica Artistic Ensemble. Monika Pőcze currently works at the Renáta Madarászová Private School of Arts in Senec as a teacher of solo and choral singing and music theory. Her students achieve excellent results in competitions and go on to study at conservatoires.
